In this task, you must conceptualize 6 scenes in which the subject is jumping* in the photograph.

The subject of these photographs must be photographed using a very **fast shutter speed** so that they have the appearance of **floating or flying** in the photograph.

Photographs must be interesting and technically well photographed.

* Want to try this idea out with different types of motion?

Try putting together a collection of six images that 'freeze' movement in the moment.

Ideas might be...

- Running water
- People running/jogging,

- Something being blowing in the wind
- A bouncing ball
- Something or Someone spinning

Shutter-Speed Process (4 Pictures): Make note of your settings for each photo.

- 1. Use Manual Mode on your camera. Set the ISO based on the lighting you are in.
- 2. Set-up camera at an appropriate distance from a 'moving' subject.
- 3. Set a **FAST Shutter-Speed (Ex: 1/1000)**; adjust the Aperture until the Light Meter reaches "0"; take picture.
- 4. **Review images**—can you see frozen movement? **YES**—go back to class. **NO**—try from the beginning OR see Mr. Goldsack.

Once you have your 6 photographs, use PowerPoint (Export -> PDF) to display your images.
