Everything at my Feet

The Task

- Take a Bird's Eye View photo of a collection of items that you feel represent you.
- Approach this like a self-portrait, except it will be of three items plus your feet.



Things to Consider #1

- You can take this photo at school or at home.
- You can use a DSLR or your phone's camera.
- If you would like to take a DSLR home to use, please see Mr. Goldsack for more details.



- Your photo will need to include 3 items (that represent you) and your feet.
- Remember it's a Bird's Eye View perspective.



Things to Consider #3

- Consider the surface you use for your photograph.
- Something simple or plain will work best.
- You don't want your background competing with your main subjects.



Things to Consider #4

- Lighting!
- Outdoors when sunny can be very harsh (lots of shadows).
- Indoors with artificial lighting (using a light-bulb) often looks dark or strangely coloured.
- Try to be near a window (best of both worlds)



Things to Consider #5

- Take the “Full” picture.
- Remember we can isolate and crop out the edges in post-production



Things to Consider #6

- Colours.
- Colours of your chosen items—do they go together? (Complementary? Monochromatic? Analogous?)
