

Public Domain Resources

At the start of every year, all kinds of works (images, texts, source code, art, scripts, etc.) get added to the Public Domain.

What exactly is Public Domain?

Essentially it means that these items are no longer restricted by copyright laws and can be used by anyone. In the United States, copyright laws have a bunch of small caveats, but the most notable clauses for entering works into the public domain are 95 years after first publication or 70 years after the creator has died.

In 2024, this first incarnation of Mickey Mouse, from Steamboat Willie, entered the Public Domain.
