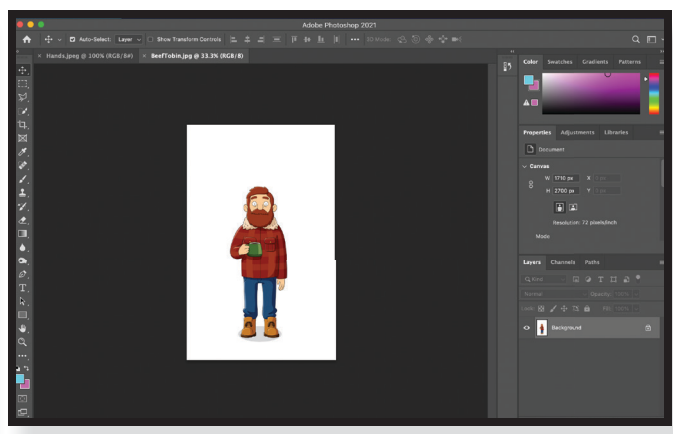
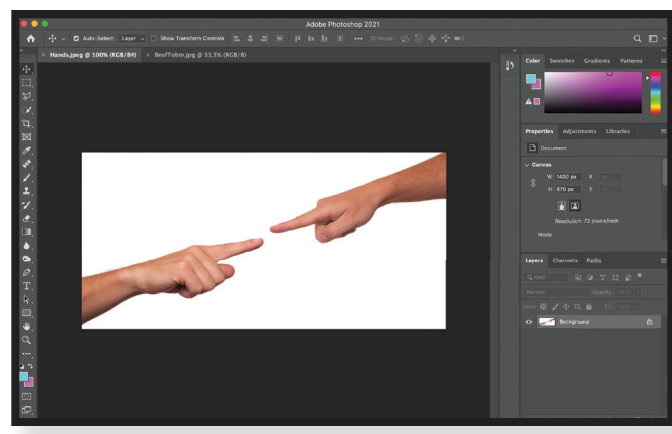
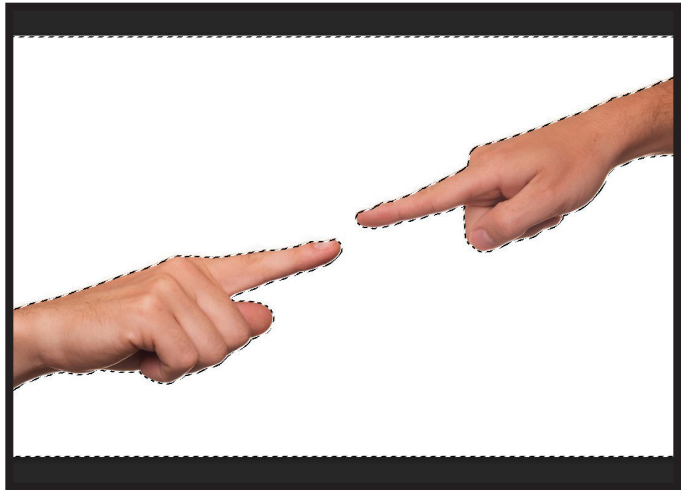
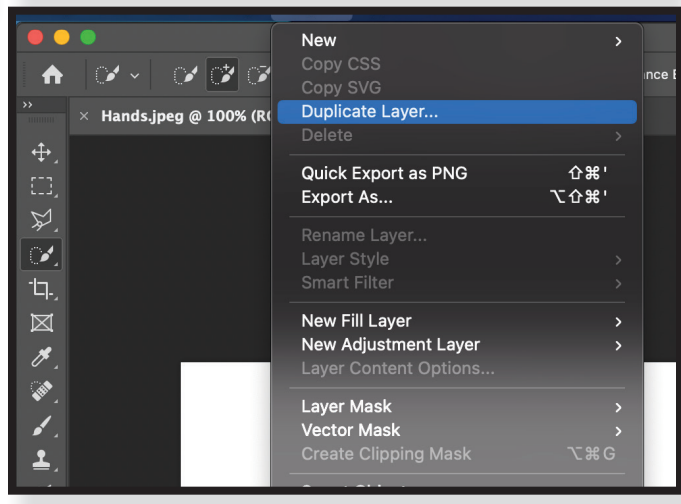


# How To Guide: Slice It Up

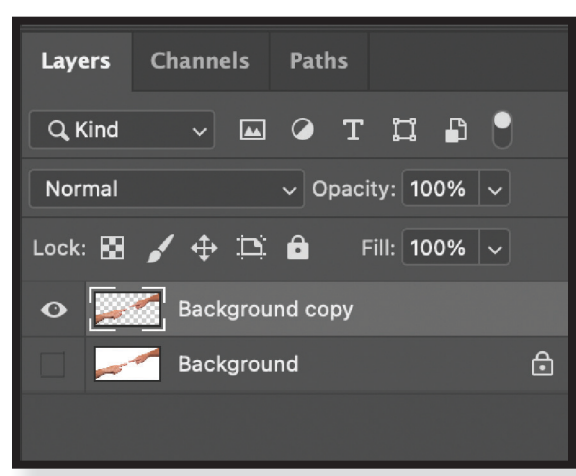
Step 1: Open Both your files in Photoshop. They should be in different tabs.



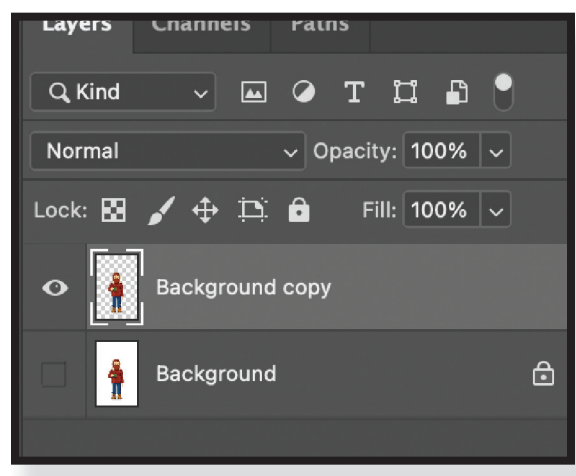
Step 2: Make Duplicates of the Background Layer in each file. (Layer -> Duplicate Layer)



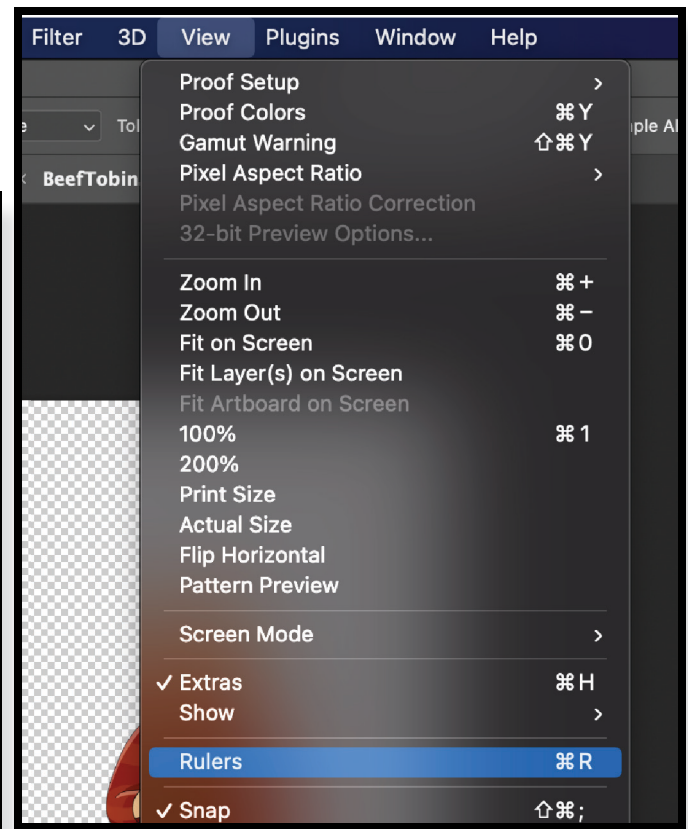
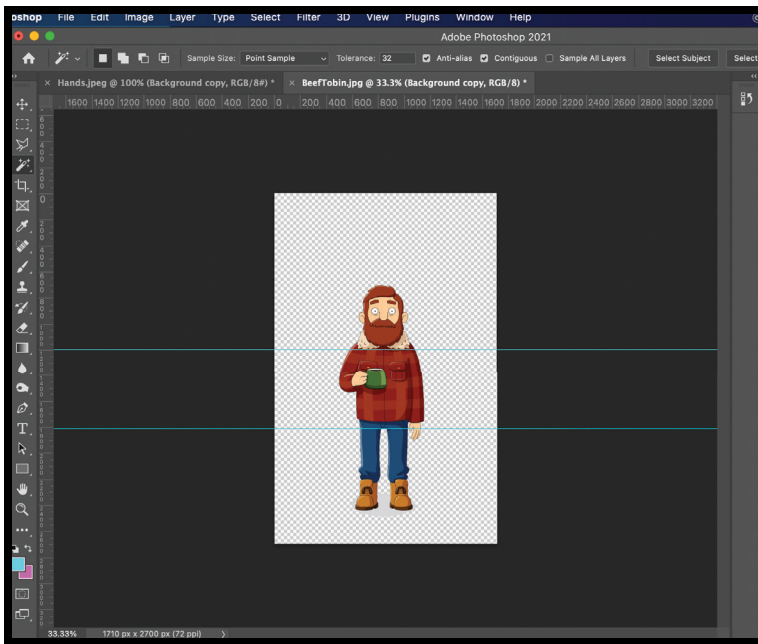
Step 3: Select the Magic Wand Tool from left side toolbar. Click on the background and press Delete.  
 Step 4: Turn the Visibility (Eyeball) of the bottom layer off.



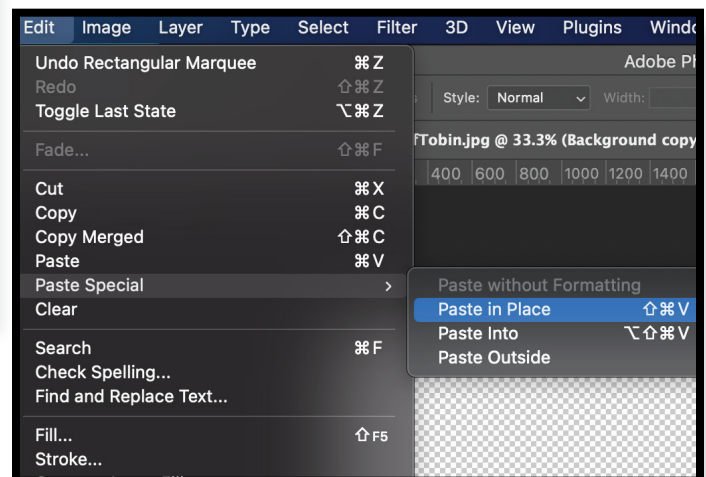
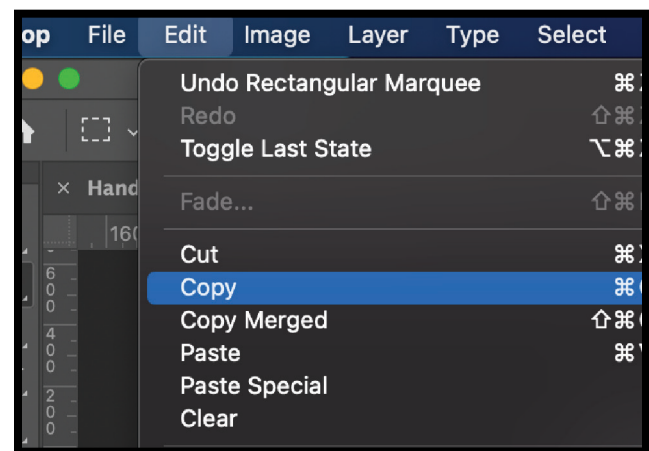
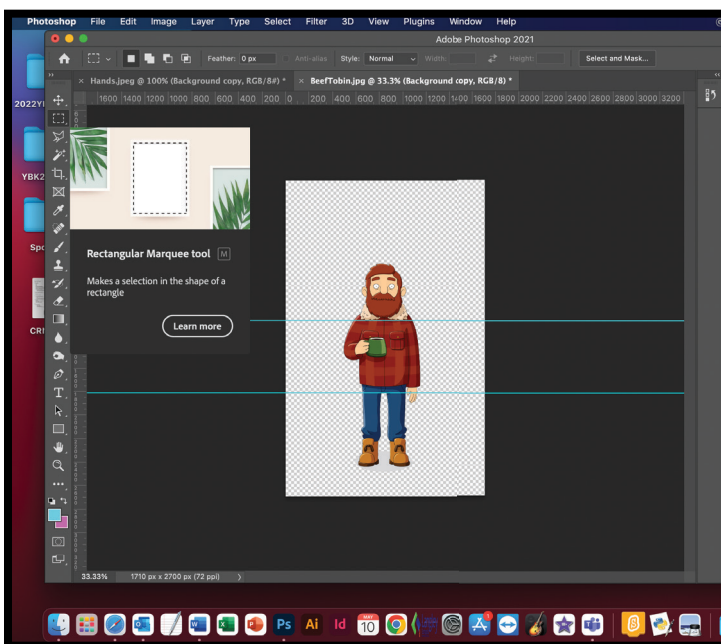
Step 5: Repeat Steps 3 and 4 in the other file.



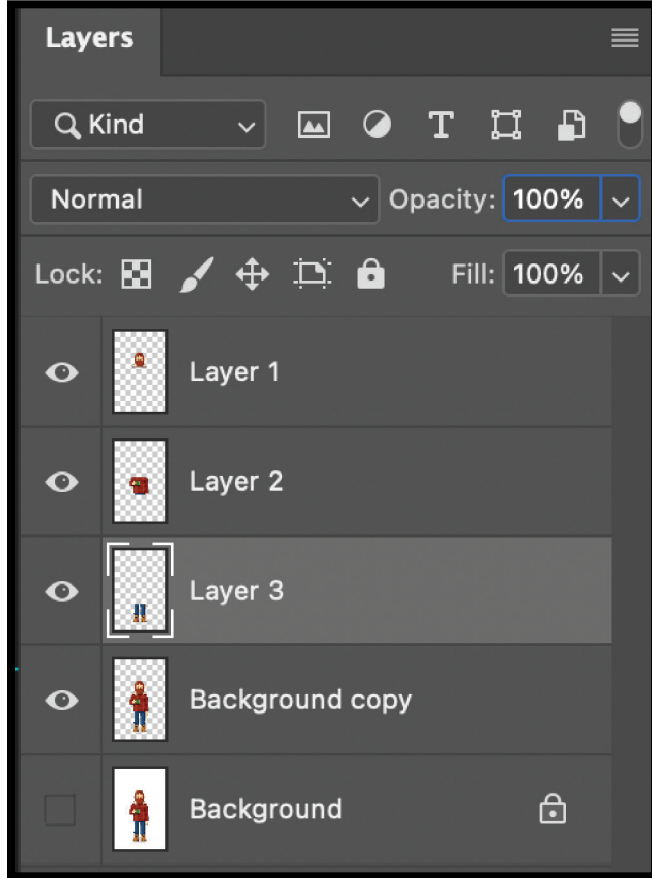
Step 6: Go to the View Menu (top)  
 Select Rulers (Cmd + R).  
 Drag from the rulers, guides to make 3  
 sections of your image.



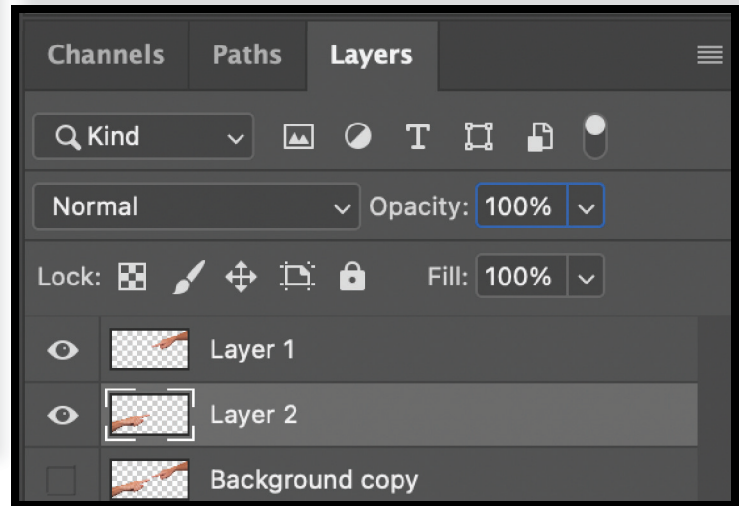
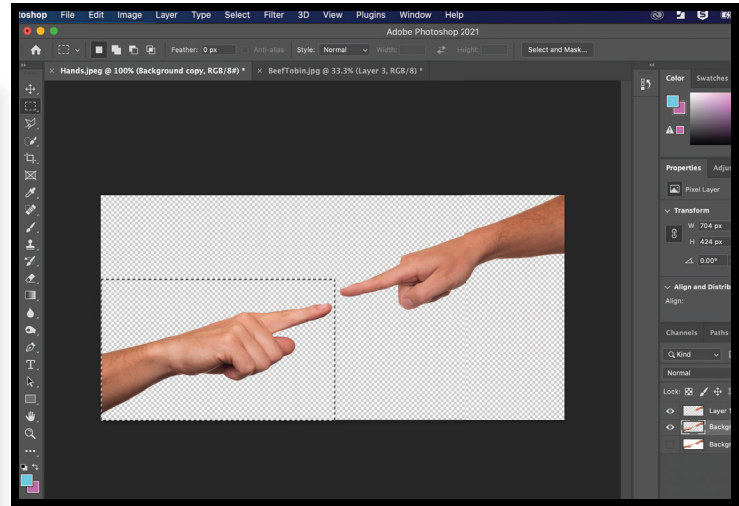
Step 7: Use the Rectangular Marquee Tool  
 and select the top section.  
 Go to Edit -> Copy  
 Go to Edit -> Paste Special -> Paste In Place



Step 7: Turn the visibility off on the layer with the full image.  
 Now select each piece layer and move the object accordingly.



Step 8: Go to the Hands file.  
 Use the Rectangular Marquee Tool to select one hand at a time.  
 Copy and Paste to isolate each hand.



Step 9: Paste the hands into the main file.  
 Adjust their size and position (Cmd + T).



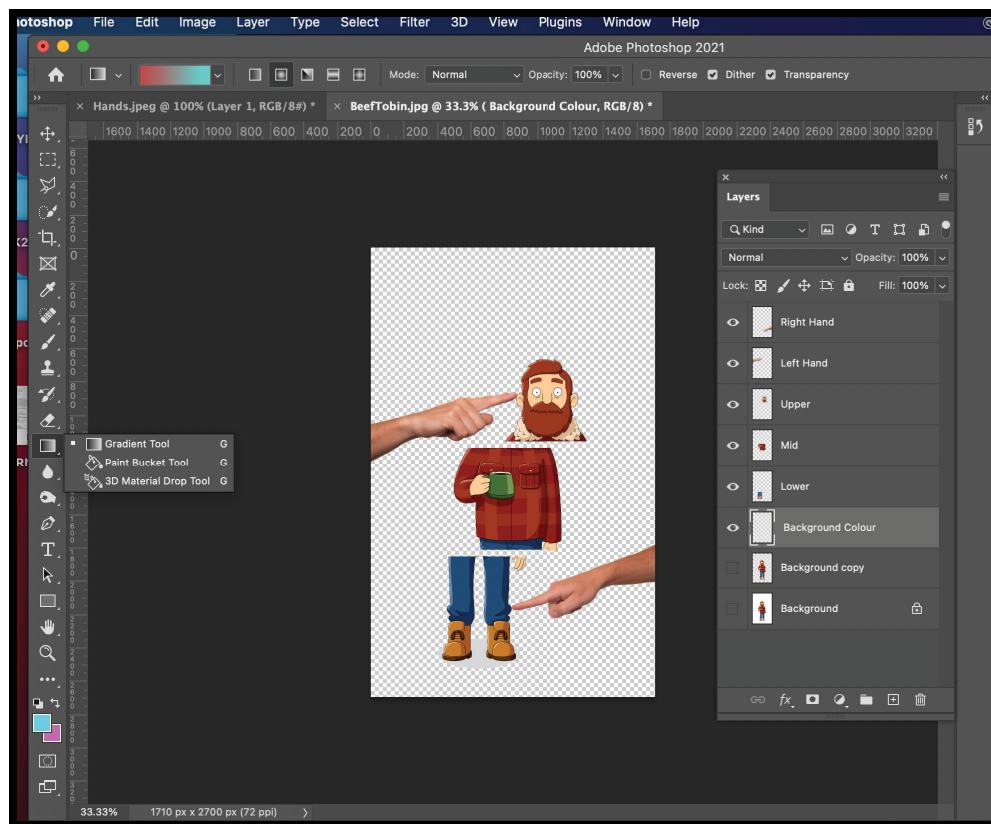
Step 10:  
Add a New Layer

Move this layer underneath  
all the visible layers.

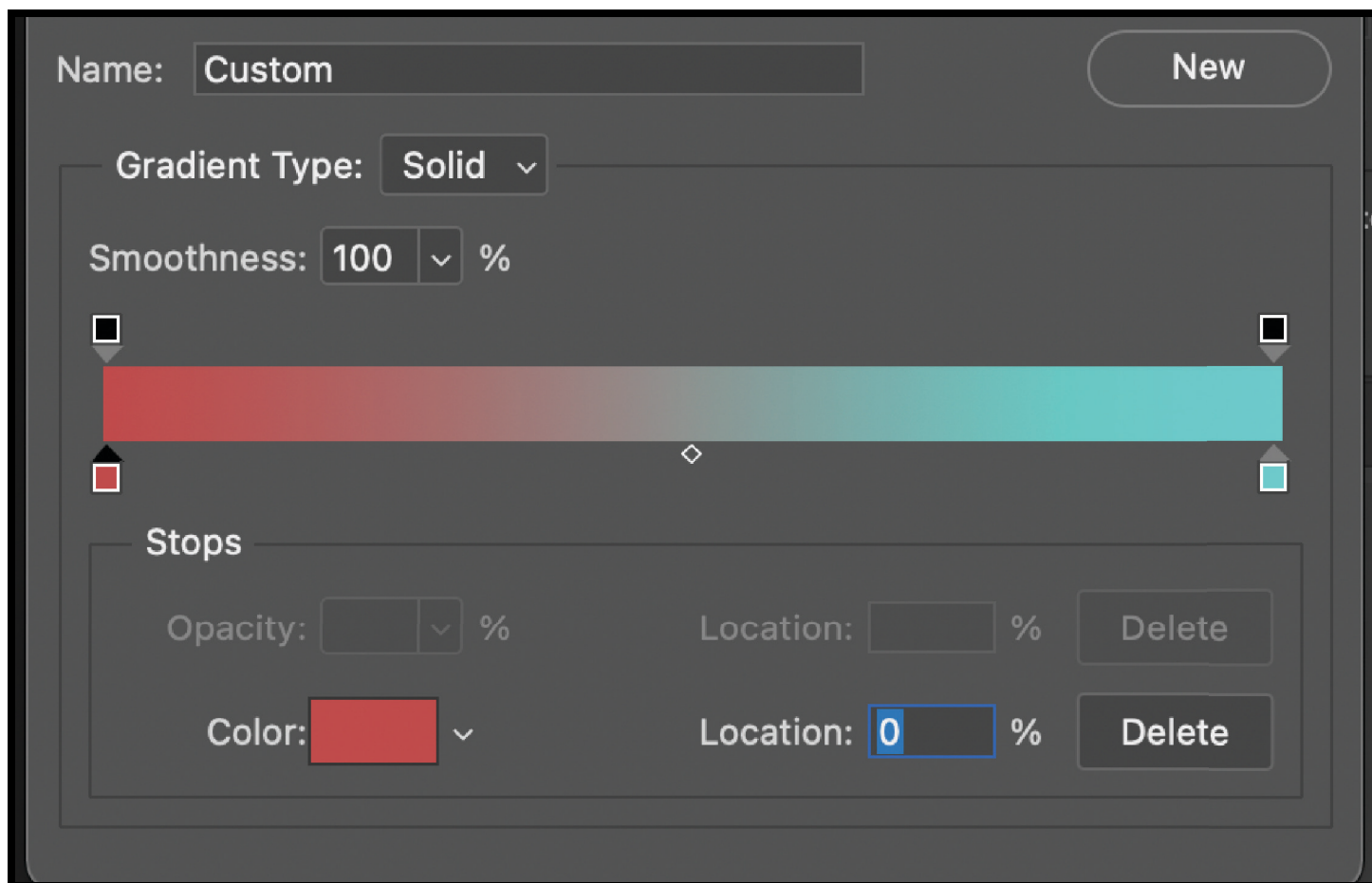
Step 11:  
Select the Gradient Tool (G)

Click the Colour Bar on the  
top-left part of the screen.

A new window will open.



Step 12: In the new window, click one of the bottom squares on the colour bar.  
Click on the Colour Panel at the bottom of the window change the colour.  
Repeat these steps for the other block.



Step 13: Now click and drag across your image to add the gradient to your file.

That's it. You're now done!
