Viewpoint can make a world of difference in how an image appears to an audience. Time for you to check out the world from some different angles.

Task:

Choose 4 different subjects to photograph. For each subject you need to capture it from both points of view (**Bird's Eye** and **Worm's Eye**). Please be mindful of your safety when getting these shots. Below are some ideas to get you thinking...

- Cell Phone
- Somewhere Outside
- Sign
- Person
- Bench or Picnic Table
- Field Bleachers
- Book, Binder, or Writing Device
- Shoes
- Something from your backpack

***You can use Auto, AV, or TV settings on a camera. You can also use your phone.
If working with a partner(s), each person needs their OWN photographs.***

Postproduction:

- Upload your photos to your computer.
- Use **PowerPoint** to display your photos. 1 subject with 2 points of view per slide.
- **Include the type of subject and viewpoint with each photo.**
- Save file LastNameFirstNameEye
 - o Ex. SmithBobEye
- Export file to PDF.
- Complete and Save Self-Assessment form.
- Hand in PDF and Self-Assessment form.
